EXHIBITIONS AND INSTALLATIONS

SHADOWS WITHOUT BORDERS (photos)

November 13 to January 6

Created by Montreal artist duo Mere Phantoms, the interactive installation Shadows Without Borders asks visitors to reflect on exile, what defines our identity, and the strength of our connection to that irreplaceable place called «home.»

As you travel through this shadow world with flashlights, discover pieces created during workshops in refugee communities in Greece and Turkey alongside work made by the artists. Playing with shadow and light, you are invited to highlight an object, a moment or a place, or cast them into darkness. Although it started with an initial shadow installation, the work will evolve throughout its run as newcomers to Canada are invited to create and contribute their own paper cutouts inspired by the experiences that brought them to Montreal and the future they imagine in this new land that they could one day call «home.»

Relive the magic of Ogilvy's mechanical holiday window displays at the McCord Museum! November 13 to January 6 Victoria Street and Level 2

Come view the Enchanted Worlds and receive an entertaining «seek and find» for free!

The Mill in the Forest – Presented by İÖGO nanö

Every holiday season since 1947, the mechanical window displays of the Ogilvy store on St. Catherine Street West have transported young and old to a magic world of the imagination. Custom-designed by German toymaker Steiff, the two displays entitled The Enchanted Village and The Mill in the Forest depict a German-style forest scene featuring stuffed animals handmade by the company. Similar to the creations of other major department stores like Macy's in New York City and the Galeries Lafayette in Paris, these displays are among the last of their kind in North America. In March 2018, Holt Renfrew donated them to the McCord Museum with the goal of preserving the displays and continuing this iconic Montreal tradition.

Thanks to the support of İÖGO nanö, the McCord Museum is bringing back the magic and wonder of yesteryear by displaying the mechanical holiday window The Mill in the Forest outside the museum.

As you visit the attic belonging to the grandparents of twins William and Sara, discover a collection of toys dating from 1890 to the present day. Filled with forgotten treasures, the attic has become a repository for the memories of all the families who have lived in the house. Containing a rich and fascinating world where childhood is frozen in time, piles of boxes have become the final resting place for G. I. Joe, Barbie, Mr. Potato Head, rocking horses, toboggans, stuffed animals, board games, old dolls, toy soldiers, furniture, books and photographs.

SCREENING OF THE DOCUMENTARY BAGAGES

J. A. Bombardier Theatre

With the participation of artist Maya Ersan of Mere Phantoms and Director Paul Tom Bagages is a documentary featuring teenage immigrants (ages 12 to 17) studying at Paul-Gé-

rin-Lajoie-d'Outremont High School, all of whom have lived in Montreal for less than two years. Through drama workshops and staged scenes, they share their stories of immigration and integration. With a wisdom well beyond their years that will leave no one unmoved, these young students recount their journeys with a disarming authenticity. Their accounts move from an «elsewhere and before» to a «here and now.» Following the screening, artist Maya Ersan and director Paul Tom will present their respective projects, which offer different perspectives on the migration experience.
