

WEARING OUR IDENTITY – THE FIRST PEOPLES COLLECTION
90 MINUTES

First Peoples' identity is profoundly linked to their dress. The permanent exhibition *Wearing our Identity – The First Peoples Collection* invites visitors to learn about the importance of clothing in the development, preservation and communication of social, cultural, political and spiritual identities of the First Nations, Inuit and Métis. Dress reflects tradition and innovation, illustrating the balance between ancestral knowledge and contemporary social change.





NOTMAN, A VISIONARY PHOTOGRAPHER
FROM NOVEMBER 4 TO MARCH 26
90 MINUTES



This exhibition offers a new perspective on the career of William Notman (1826–1891), one of Canada's most important photographers of the 19th century. Bold, artistic, a builder and proficient networker, Notman is revealed through almost 300 photographs and objects from the Museum's collection. Multimedia installations animate the exhibition and illustrate the modernity of the period.

This visit may be combined with the outdoor tour *The Notman House Neighbourhood* as part of a one-day package.

MONTREAL – POINTS OF VIEW
UNTIL JANUARY 22
90 MINUTES

Discover or rediscover Montreal through the exhibition *Montreal – Points of View*, which explores ten different facets of the city's history. From its first residents before the arrival of the Europeans to the city of today with its metro and skyscrapers, this tour is a journey through time and space. Montreal's urban development unfolds via objects and photographs from the Museum's vast collection.

FASHIONING EXPO 67
FROM MARCH 9 TO OCTOBER 1
90 MINUTES

Montreal hosted the World's Fair from April to October 1967. More than 50 million people passed through the turnstiles of Expo 67 and were surrounded by creativity, including in fashion. Spectacular photographs taken on the site, hostess uniforms and fashion shows featuring models on roller skates will take visitors back to 1967, when Canadian fashion made its mark and Montreal asserted itself as a city ahead of its time.


MONTREAL, OUR STORY

BEGINNERS TO ADVANCED LEVELS (FRENCH)

Take part in a journey through time and space to learn about the people living on the Island of Montreal, from the first occupants to today. The tour is presented in a way that encourages discussion, allowing participants to share their memories and compare their cultures of origin with that of Montreal.

In a workshop, visitors experience Iroquoian technology first-hand by creating a clay pot. A booklet about Quebec culture is offered to participants at the end of the visit.

EDUCATION BEHIND THE SCENES

120 MINUTES

TEACHERS IN CONTINUING EDUCATION AND FUTURE TEACHERS

Future teachers as well as those in continuing education are invited behind the scenes of the McCord Museum's education service to explore its pedagogical potential. The objects in the collection are valuable resources for developing historical thinking in students. This activity unveils the possibilities for interpreting history through a visit to the Museum.



CANADA'S FIRST PEOPLES

FROM JANUARY 24
90 MINUTES

BEGINNER TO ADVANCED LEVELS (FRENCH)

The exhibition *Wearing our Identity – The First Peoples Collection* shows how men and women express themselves through their garments. Learning about Canada's First Peoples facilitates the integration of newcomers, allowing them to compare their cultures of origin with those of Aboriginal peoples.

In a workshop, visitors create a print inspired by Inuit engraving.

SENIORS

History buffs who are 60 years of age and older are invited to a unique experience, a sensory workshop that will awaken emotions and revive memories. Participants' life stories bring artefacts to life during exhibition visits and discussions. Needless to say, those stories build links between the past and the present.



MONTREAL SOUNDSCAPE

UNTIL JANUARY 22
90 MINUTES

ADAPTED TO STUDENTS FROM INTERMEDIATE TO ADVANCED LEVELS (ENGLISH AND FRENCH)

This audio game for tablet takes visitors on a search for objects in *Montreal – Points of View* following clues drawn from the sounds of the city. Selections of music, poetry and theatre help them answer riddles. Each correct answer produces a piece of the puzzle, with the full image revealed at the end of the game. This new way to view an exhibition allows visitors to have fun while discovering the city's history.



OUTDOORS

THE NOTMAN HOUSE NEIGHBOURHOOD 90 MINUTES

As part of the opening of the exhibition Notman, A Visionary Photographer, the Museum is offering a tour of the Milton Park district, where you'll see 51 Sherbrooke Street West, the home owned by celebrated photographer William Notman (1826-1891). The tour pays particular attention to the area's architectural heritage, its development and the various uses of the buildings throughout history.



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THE GOLDEN SQUARE MILE, YESTERDAY AND TODAY APRIL TO NOVEMBER 90 MINUTES

Visitors take a tour of the Golden Square Mile accompanied by a guide and equipped with a tablet and the *MTL Urban Museum* (MUM) application. This overview of the area's architecture allows them to discover luxurious mansions built by influential figures of the 19th and 20th centuries. The tour sketches a portrait of a century in transformation.


