The Museum presents two themes inspired by the richness of its collections and in line with current exhibitions. For 2019, the themes are *Fun with photography* and *From coast to coast to coast.*

The Education Department wishes to hire a student who knows how to enthusiastically and interestingly communicate the presented themes to the young campers in order to offer them an exciting discovery of the Museum and its exhibitions in a bilingual environment. The incumbent will be in charge of coordinating the day camp and daycare activities in order to maintain the quality of services.

Reporting to the Head, Education, Community Engagement and Cultural Programs, the Coordinator will have the following responsibilities:

- Participate in the elaboration and coordination of proposed workshops
- Plan and implement the training sessions of the camp counselors
- Coordinate the logistics of groups of children at the day camp
- Liaise with parents about enrollment, child health, expectations and concerns that may arise
- Monitor feedback for the evaluation of the two programs
- Ensure that quality standards are observed in services offered
- When required, give tours and workshops for children at the day camp
- Supervise, in collaboration with the Head, Education Programs, the work of camp counselor and day care staff

Employment conditions:

- Temporary summer student employment; 35 hours per week, for 13 weeks
- Compensation of \$19,25 per hour; employment starting on June 3 and ending on August 30, 2019
- Candidates must be eligible for Young Canada Works program for heritage establishments

Qualifications and Profile Required:

- University degree in relevant field (history, art, archeology, museology, education) or current enrolment in a related university degree program
- 2 years relevant experience or as a day camp counselor
- Dynamism, sense of responsibility, organizational ability, resourcefulness, excellent interpersonal skills, and ability to mobilize a team

- Fluency in both English and French
